

#### Edna Parker's 115th Birthday

Edna Scott Parker, the world's oldest person, celebrated her 115th birthday on April 20, 2008 at her nursing home in Indiana.

"When I left Indiana, Grandmother was still reading cards," wrote her granddaughter. "She is really enjoying them. We hoped she could have 115 cards — one for each year. In



fact, she received many more than that number." The Daily News offered a place online for readers to wish Mrs. Parker a happy birthday. Some 80 people gave their best wishes to her and more wishes were coming from around the world. To the family she is just "grandma" but actually she is famous throughout the world.

About 200 people attended her birthday party. Edna loved chatting with the people and enjoyed taking pictures with them. She dressed in pearls, a blue and white dress and new white shoes. She held a red rose during the celebration. She looked terrific. She laughed and smiled as relatives and guests let go 115 balloons into sunny skies outside her nursing home. That was the highlight of the celebration. Edna's family were so busy that they forgot to get a piece of cake for her! Edna did a radio



interview on Monday morning and signed two autographs. She's an amazing woman. Guinness World Records presented her with a certificate because she is the oldest living person."

"It will take me six months to calm down and then the next six months I'll start thinking and preparing for the 116th celebration." Edna Parker later said.






