# **Speaking Test: Introduction and Part One**

The Speaking Test has three parts and lasts about fourteen minutes. For this part of the test you will be with at least one other candidate (and sometimes two). It carries 25% of the total marks and each part tests a different speaking skill.

Part	Speaking task	Grouping	Length
1	Answering questions and giving personal information on topics such as current job or studies, future plans, and preferences.	One-to-one	About 3 minutes
2	A one-minute presentation on a work-related or business theme, using the prompts provided. Each candidate also asks a question on the topic.	Individual and pairwork	About 6 minutes
3	A discussion between the two candidates based on a business-related situation, followed by a follow-up discussion with the examiner.	Pairwork	About 5 minutes

In Part One, the examiner will begin by asking you some general questions and you can prepare some typical answers for this part. For instance, you can practise talking about who you are, where you come from and what you do in your job or in your studies. This stage of the exam is like a general conversation. Towards the end of the three minutes, the examiner might ask you one or two questions which require you to give your brief opinion on a business topic.
