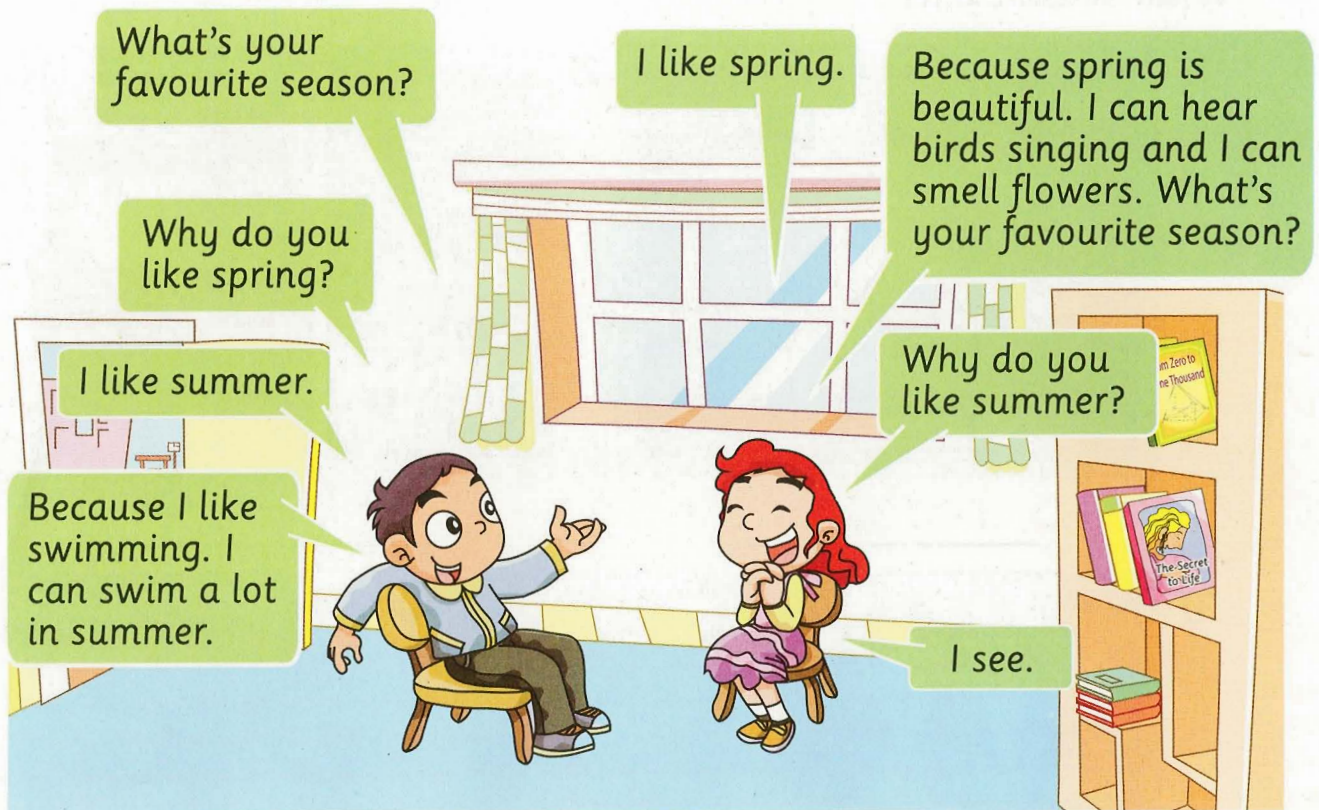

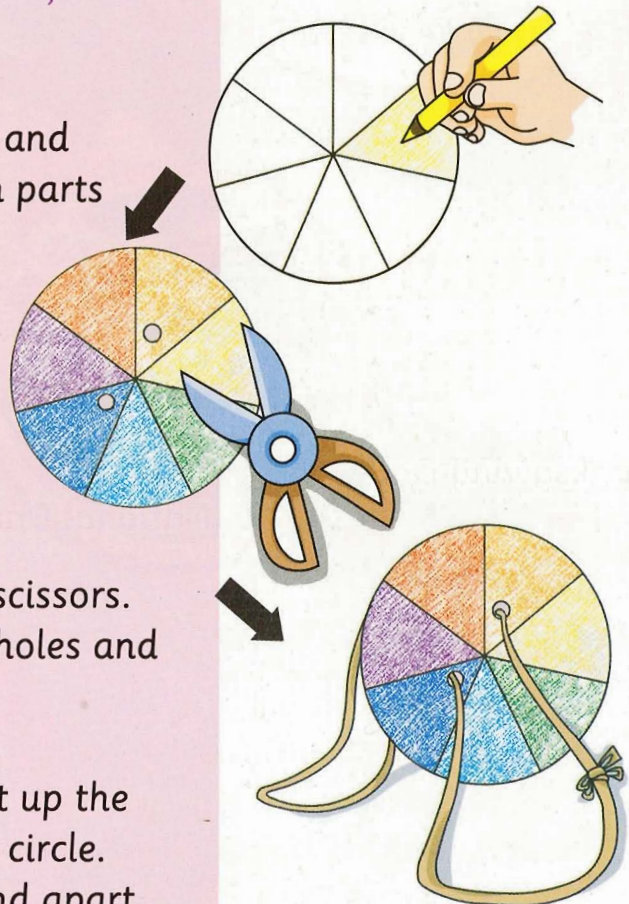
8. Read and do. Let's make a rainbow.

3) Hold an end in each hand. Twist up the thread by spinning your hand in a circle. Then move your hands together and apart.



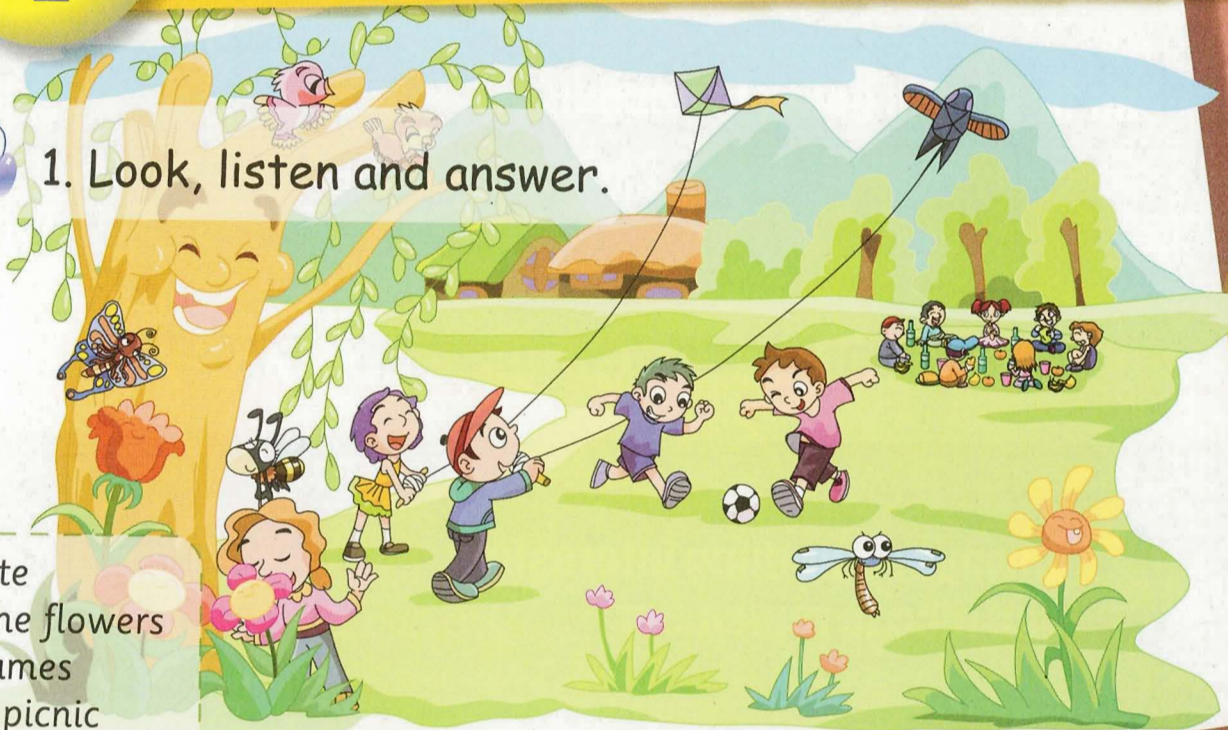

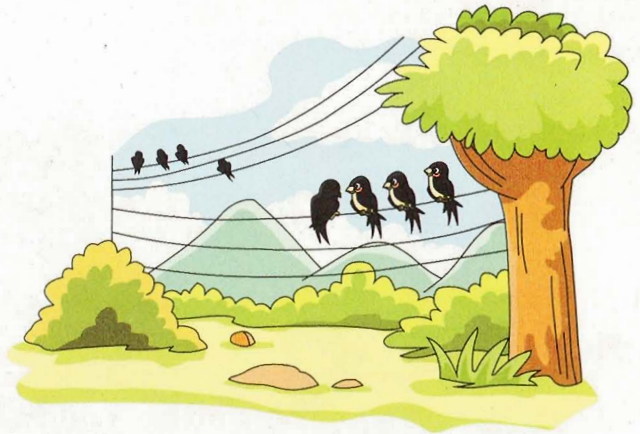
2. Read and answer.
